Trainer dares to Finke big with gelding

"I FINKE he's pretty good – how's that for a headline?"

That was jubilant Darwin trainer Pat Johnston's joke to the NT News after his star three-year-old Delta D'Or cruised home in the \$50,000 NT Guineas at Alice Springs yesterday.

The gelding, ridden by top Territory jockey Ray Vigar, won by almost five lengths over Danny Penna's Threepeat on the first day of the Alice Springs Cup Carnival. The fact Delta D'Or is being

compared to the late great Territory horse Finke is no joke, though – he is fast mounting a compelling case.

Finke tragically passed away from a heart attack moments after finishing fourth in his last race in Adelaide on February 25.

The four-year-old collected over \$300,000 in prizemoney and won last year's edition of the NT Guineas, followed victories in the Darwin Guineas and NT Derby.

Johnston plans to spell his champion three-year-old before plotting a course similar

to the late champion, and aiming him for the Darwin Guineas on July 8. The charismatic trainer believes Delta D'Or can follow Finke's lead after his big win yesterday.

"I was stressing like mad after two horses got scratched from the gates before the race, hoping it wasn't my horse," Johnston said.

"Then he jumped to the front and led, and it was a procession from there.

"It was an exceptional ride from Ray Vigar.

"I Finke he's pretty good – how does that sound?"

Meanwhile, fellow Top End trainer Gary Clarke's Ticket To Toorak and Big Man took out the Gem Cave Dash (1000m) and Scope Building Handicap (1400m) in races three and four, both worth \$25,000.

Another Darwin trainer, Kerry Petrick, saw her won four-year-old gelding Poet's Choice win the \$18,500 race one. Leanne Gillett (Short Shift in race two), Carly Cook (St Cajetan in race five) and Norm Bracken (Clever Tommy in race seven) were the other winning trainers.

Butcher carves up Crocs for big haul

A 28-point haul from Robbie Butcher helped University continue their perfect start to the season at University Oval yesterday.
